Snow information / best period:

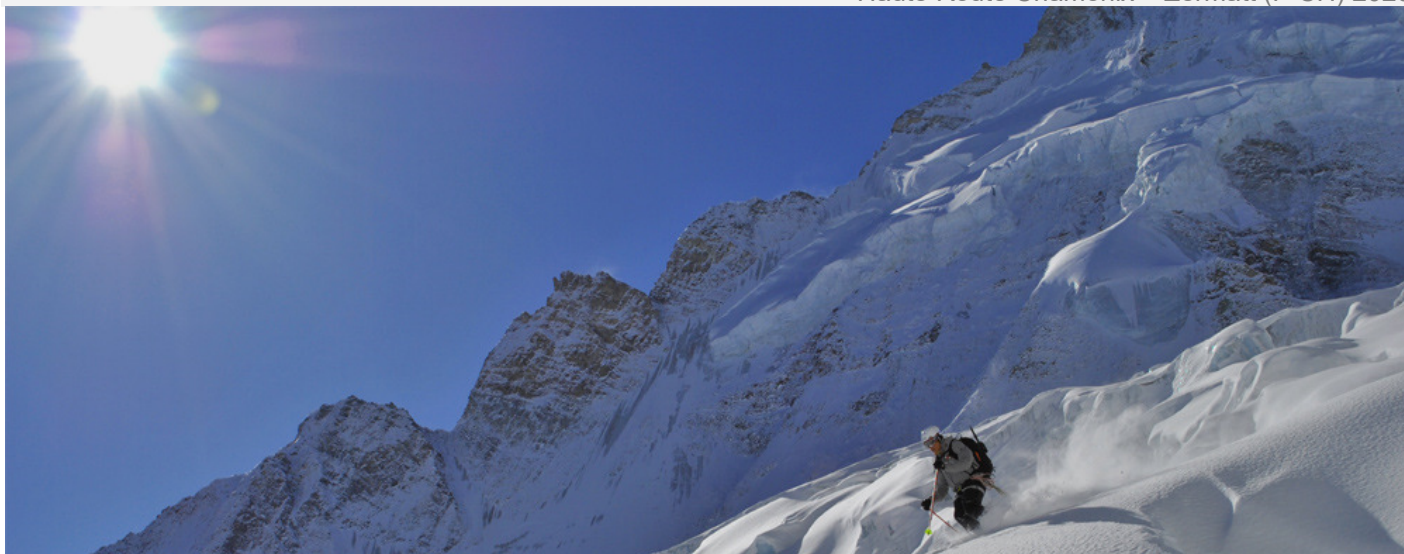
The best ski touring time for the Haute Route is from mid-March to mid-May. In this period we will find mostly perfect conditions for touring and skiing.

Group size:

The prices are based on a minimum number of participants of four participants. However, any time we can organize this trip for smaller groups and other dates tailor made. Please contact directly our office Info@Heli-Guides.com.

Itinerary:

- 1st day: Individual travel to the meeting point at 8:30a.m. in Chamonix / Argentiere. Material check and ascent with the cable car to the Grand Montet. We ski down to the Argentiere Glacier from where we will climb via Col du Passon and Col del Tour up to the Trient hut where we stay for the night.
- 2nd day: Short climb to the Punte de Orny and descent into Val d 'Arpette. Transfer by taxi or bus to Bourg St. Pierre 1.689m. Overnight in a hotel.
- 3rd day: We climb up to Cab Valsorey, 3,023 m overnight in the hut.
- 4th day: Climb up to Plateau de Couloir 3664m, and traverse to the Col du Sonadon, 3,507 m, we ski down the glacier of du Mont Duvand down to the Cab.de Charion, 2,462 m overnight in the hut.
- 5th day: We climb up the Glacier du Breney zur Pigne d' Arolla 3796m. Descent with the skis to the Cab des Vignettes, 3.160m overnight in the hut.
- 6th day: We climb over Col de l'Évêque, Col du M. Brulé and Col de Valpelline in the direction of Tété Blanche from where we ski down until Zermatt. Transfer to Chamonix or overnight stay in Zermatt.



Requirements:

You will need to be a safe off-piste skier in all snow conditions. Physical fitness for up to 1,400m daily ascent and subsequent descent. Experience in dealing with the crampons and ice ax. For group booking's, we can take care individual of the skiing/snowboard and group level.

Additional costs:

Overnight stay in the hut with half board (*also for the mountain guide*), lifts, lunch, drinks, taxi and bus transfers (*also for the mountain guide*), rental equipment if not included, transfer from Zermatt to Chamonix and all other services not included

Included services:

- Mountain guide IFMGA for the ski touring days
- Organisation and reservation of huts and hotel for the trip
- Safety equipment if necessary avalanche transceiver, probe and shuffle for the week
- Technical equipment if necessary harness, crampons and ice axe for the week
